 - a. Compare and contrast the functions of the Department of Defence Production and the Department of Defence Research and Development. How do they support the defense sector?
 - b. Evaluate the importance of the Cabinet Committee on Security in shaping defense policies and strategies. How does it function?
2. A defense contractor has been accused of breaching a contract and providing substandard equipment to the armed forces. Analyze the legal implications of the breach and discuss the possible remedies available to the government and the contractor to resolve the dispute and mitigate the damages caused.

3. A defense personnel has been charged with a violation of the Army Act during an active operation. Analyze the legal provisions under the Army Act and discuss the factors that the court would consider while adjudicating the case.

 - a. A defense equipment manufacturing company has been accused of violating the provisions of the Arms Act by exporting restricted goods without proper authorization. Analyze the legal implications of the violation and discuss the potential penalties that the company may face under the law.
 - b. Discuss the significance of the National Investigation Agency Act in combating terrorism. How does it empower the security agencies?
5. A military officer has been subjected to a court-martial proceeding on charges of insubordination. Analyze the legal aspects of the court-martial and discuss the possible defense strategies that the officer's legal team can adopt.
6. You are a member of the Armed Forces Tribunal. A defense personnel has filed an appeal challenging the verdict of a court-martial. Discuss the legal principles and factors that the tribunal would consider while reviewing the appeal and rendering a decision.
7. Compare and contrast court-martial proceedings in the Indian Army, Indian Air Force, and Indian Navy. How do they differ in terms of jurisdiction and process?
