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1. Define “cyber crime”. Explain the essentials of a cyber crime with the help of cases and relevant provisions. (10 Marks)

2. Mr X beheaded a minor girl belonging to a particular tribe. The entire act was video graphed by him. The video was uploaded on a web platform called XDR.Com owned by Mr Ashish. One whistle blower informed the management of XDR.Com about the video uploaded after one hour of uploading. XDR Management took 10 days to check the content of video and then removed it from their platform. During this period 200 people bought that video. Discuss the liability of Mr Ashish in this factual situation as per the present rules applicable to intermediaries and decided cases. (20 Marks)

3. Mr. Saleem was driving a car in Mumbai. On the way he bought two whisky bottles and obtained an electronic receipt for the same. He consumed one bottle of liquor and then continued driving. He had hit two people who were crossing the road and they died on the spot. Prosecutor submitted the electronic receipt obtained in the liquor shop as an evidence that Saleem was in a drunken state when he committed the accident. Examine whether this evidence is admissible with the help of relevant law and provisions.
