2. The potential threat posed by cyber terrorism has provoked considerable alarm. Numerous security experts, politicians, and others have publicized the danger of cyber terrorists hacking into government and private computer systems and crippling the military, financial, and service sectors of advanced economies. Discuss the law dealing with the offence with the help of relevant provisions under Information and Technology Act.
3. The widespread use of the internet has led to public concern about individuals using this new technology to commit sexual offences. In recent years, laws have been introduced to protect children from online sexual exploitation, and increasing numbers of online sexual offenders are being processed by the criminal justice system. Discuss the law relating to obscene material in the Information and Technology Act.
4. What are various kinds of cyber-crimes relating to property? Discuss with the help of relevant provisions.
5. What are the special characteristics of cyber-crime? Differentiate it with crime in the real world.
6. Discuss the parliament attack case and the significance of the cyber evidence in proving the guilt of the accused. Point out the arguments forwarded by both the prosecution and defence counsel regarding the admissibility of digital evidence.
